The Macmillan team will be there to give you a warm welcome and will present our new materials, including digital coursebooks as well as materials for the bilingual classroom and other book-based resources.



### ROOM 1: Infants and 1<sup>st</sup> cycle Primary

#### Jill Leighton

#### Pirates' playtime!

(3 to 5-year-olds)

In this practical session we will look at material aimed at helping children to explore the world around them (a requirement of the LOE at Infantil) through more realistic storylines illustrated by a more realistic artist and *My World* lessons, which focus on emotional intelligence, the natural environment and personal autonomy. We will contrast a fantastical and real-world story with plenty of formulaic repetition and will show how to present phonics/pronunciation and *My World* content in a child-friendly way. Captain Jack will be helping out. Be prepared to play pirates!

#### Roisin O'Farrell

#### Visualising language

(6 to 7-year-olds)

In this session we will be using flashcards, posters, dossiers and coursebooks, to demonstrate some quick and easy activities to present, practise and remember language. The idea is that children will enjoy them while learning and want to do it again and again!

### ROOM 2: 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> cycle Primary

#### Roisin O'Farrell

#### Noticing language

(8 to 10-year-olds)

Children are very observant and they like puzzles and problem solving. Grammar can be viewed as a puzzle where children have to spot patterns of word order. Encouraging children to notice form helps them to understand grammar and use different structures. In this session, we will look at a range of stimulating activities that give children opportunities to notice language patterns and to apply their theories about how language works.

#### A digital tool box for Primary teachers

ICT is playing an ever greater role in English language teaching. Even the books and the board are becoming digitalised! This session aims to help teachers meet the challenge of

This session offers ideas for developing oral skills through practical activities which motivate students. We will also consider how to assess students' progress and look at what to evaluate and how to do it.

Ask any teacher what would make their classes more successful and top of the list is often class size. Fewer students would mean more individual attention and make speaking and listening activities easier to monitor and manage. But large classes are very common and there is nothing we can do about that. Motivating our students and getting them talking about themselves with each other is something we can do! In this session, we will focus on ideas which will improve students' listening skills, give them the opportunity to react to what they hear and a chance to voice their own opinions

It looks like a normal whiteboard, but offers so much more. This session will introduce teachers who are new to IWBs to some easy activities that will spice up their lessons. In particular, we will look at how you can use images, text and games to make learning fun. We will also look at what makes an activity successful and things to avoid when using this exciting new tool.
